RECOGNIZING THE BARRIERS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

Today, three-quarters of new jobs in the Washington, DC, region require education and training beyond a high school diploma. Yet, issues of access, affordability, and belonging have placed higher education out of reach for many students in our region. For students who do make it to the doors of higher education, nearly one-third will leave after their first year, often citing the lack of a support network.

Every year in Montgomery County, Maryland, hundreds of students and their families face similar hurdles in their higher education pursuits. Data suggests that even in our thriving County, gaps exist in graduation rates, college access, and degree attainment, especially for those who are firstgeneration American, immigrants, or from a lowincome family. These barriers further limit their ability to pursue a bachelor's degree. As the growth of highly skilled jobs in our region outpace the pool of available candidates, it is critical that we provide pathways to the degrees and careers that will directly power tomorrow's workforce. This means propelling students to and through higher education—especially those who have the most limited experience navigating the education system.

BUILDING EQUITABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Since its launch in 2013, The Achieving Collegiate Excellence and Success (ACES) program has been building equitable opportunities for students in Montgomery County to thrive in college and enter into a career.

A powerful partnership among Montgomery County Public Schools, Montgomery College, and the Universities at Shady Grove—Montgomery County's three public education institutions—the ACES program provides access to individualized academic coaching, career readiness, and scholarship opportunities for students who have been historically underrepresented in higher education. Our coaches work with students every step of the way, beginning in the 11th grade, continuing to community college, and through the completion of a bachelor's degree.

The result is a sharp increase in college readiness, college applications, and graduation among students enrolled in ACES, who are equipped to join the region's workforce and contribute back to the local economy.

A SUPPORTIVE PATHWAY TO A BACHELOR'S DEGREE AND BEYOND

Students connect with ACES first in high school. They are often the first in their family to pursue college. They may be first-generation Americans, immigrants, from a low-income family, or have differing abilities that have limited their ability to pursue a bachelor's degree. **At ACES, we see their promise, and we believe**

in their potential.

Our students represent a wide range of backgrounds and experiences, including;

Sara Ruiz credits ACES with providing her opportunities and guidance she otherwise may not have had, in fact, she did not consider college a part of her future until ACES showed her it was possible. Through the individualized coaching and college application guidance, provided by her ACES coach, Sara received

a full scholarship to both Montgomery College and The Universities at Shady Grove, and—after graduating in the spring of 2018 from the University of Maryland's Robert H. Smith School of Business—became the first in her family to graduate from college. In the fall, Sara will start full time at the global accounting firm, Grant Thornton.





A TRANSFORMATIVE APPROACH TO EDUCATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

ACES supports more than 2,500 students across Montgomery County's three public education institutions, but its impact is felt far beyond those numbers. ACES serves as a lifeline for parents, a point of inspiration for siblings, a challenge for peers, and a powerful tool for fostering future leaders in Montgomery County.

Achieving Collegiate Excellence and Success (ACES) is a first-of-its-kind partnership among Montgomery County Public Schools, Montgomery College, and the Universities at Shady Grove. ACES provides individualized coaching, scholarship opportunities, and career readiness programming for students who have been historically underrepresented in higher education, improving their ability to thrive in college and into a career. Each year, more than 2,500 students participate in ACES across all three institutions.
